Family Finds Hope After Pandemic Hits Home

Foundation Communities residents are resilient. But the pandemic has disrupted every household, leaving many with health concerns, reduced wages or loss of work altogether. Even Cedric Turner, an optimist by nature, found himself worried.

"Ask anybody, ask my wife, I'm a very positive person," he says "But the first week of my hours being cut, I was like 'What am I gonna do?""

Working as a Supervisor/Trainer for Delta, Cedric and his crew were servicing up to 30 flights a day before the pandemic hit. When airlines faced new restrictions, Delta reduced flights through Austin.

"We're contractors so the more flights that come in, the more we get paid," he explains. "So we weren't getting paid that much, because it was down to five flights a day."

Cedric had accepted the job with the goal of supporting his growing family. Just 10 months earlier, he and his wife Jenny had welcomed a son, Caleb Joshua.

"It really scared me to think about paying my bills, being kicked out of our apartment and just the spiral effect. I really was worried. Like, 'What am I going to do to take care of my family?"

Soon Cedric learned that Foundation Communities would not evict residents for lack of payment due to the pandemic and would allow them to repay missed rent over six months. It was welcome news, but left him wondering how he would come up with the funds.

Then a call from his Property Manager brought a wave of relief. Cedric found out that his rent had been covered by donations to the Emergency Assistance Fund. "When I got the call that my rent has been paid, I was like, really speechless," he recalls.

Thanks to an outpouring of support, Cedric was one of hundreds of FC residents to receive rent assistance since April.

"It just touched my heart that during this tough time there are people in this world that want to help their neighbor out," Cedric continues. "I'm so thankful."
