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Immigrant Family Finds Safety, Stability through Affordable Housing



Like many immigrants, the Balingene family came to the US to escape the danger of their homeland. Ethnic violence had spilled into the Democratic Republic of the Congo from the genocidal civil war in Rwanda. After a few years in a refugee camp, the family had an opportunity through a US State Department program to legally emigrate to Central Texas.

"I chose to be part of American people. It looked like it was safe here," said Jeremiah.

As sponsored refugees, the Balingenes had an apartment waiting for them at our Trails at Vintage Creek and more than a year of assistance with rent and utilities. Jeremiah had a difficult time finding work. He settled for a minimum wage job sorting trash that barely paid enough to buy food for his family of seven (at that time). They had many questions about how things work in America, but they struggled to understand American English. Jeremiah says if not for the support they received from staff at Vintage Creek and its Learning Center, they might have returned to the danger of Africa.

"Vintage Creek, they have a program for English. I was going there every single day to learn how to speak American English," said Jeremiah.

After a couple of years, Jeremiah was hired at Vintage Creek as a porter, and through hard work he has became one of our lead maintenance technicians. In 2017, his family of 10 moved into their own five-bedroom home.

Healthy Food Pantries Receive Award

Prosper Financial Wellness Helping Central Texans Dropped from Medicaid

Foundation Communities launched the Prosper Benefits Assistance Program in the spring of this year. That was just in time to help tackle a healthcare crisis. According to some lawmakers, about a million Texans have lost access to Medicaid since April. That's when the automatic renewal for Medicaid that was put in place by the Biden Administration because of COVID-19 expired.

Many Central Texans who recently lost Medicaid benefits are being referred to our Benefits Assistance Program by other nonprofits and clinics. We're finding that many people were dropped because they weren't aware they had to apply for renewal. Many had moved and didn't receive the mailed notifications. There are a lot of documents required to apply for Medicaid and that's where many people get stuck. FC Benefits Enrollment specialist Jessica Valdez said, "Sometimes they tell us they don't have time to collect documents while having to work and care for their families. Particularly, employer verification forms can be difficult to obtain."

Foundation Communities is available to help Central Texans get renewed or apply for Medicaid Benefits. For those who are not eligible, our Health Coverage teams can get them signed up for affordable health insurance through the Healthcare.gov Marketplace.
