Texas continues to have one of the highest uninsured rates in the country, with many left without coverage as continual enrollment for Medicaid and CHIP ended, affecting hundreds of thousands of applicants. We thank our generous funders, collaborative partners, talented team, and dedicated volunteers who helped Central Texans enroll in affordable health coverage this Open Enrollment season.

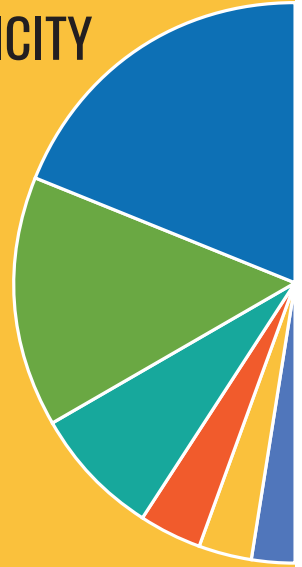
