Sprucing Up, Scaling Up Affordable Housing on Lamar Square

Foundation Communities is excited to have entered into a partnership with Mary Lee Foundation, an Austin non-profit that has provided services and affordable housing for people with disabilities for more than 60 years.

We have taken over ownership and management of most of the housing in Lamar Square, the city block where Mary Lee has been located since 1974. We will renovate or replace most of that housing, which Mary Lee says is long overdue,



"We are excited to partner with Mary Lee to create a new community that will be designed for their clients and for new families in the heart of central Austin," said Foundation Communities Executive Director Walter Moreau.

Lamar Square will have a new Learning Center for youth after-school and summer learning, adult education and fitness classes. Also, on-site case management, a Healthy Food Pantry, and a park with outdoor amenities.

Mary Lee's Executive Director Russ Walker says, "We were way out of our field, and we didn't have the resources, the manpower, the connections, the funding to turn this around quickly enough."

The redevelopment of Lamar Square will take place in three phases. It will involve the rehabilitation of more than 150 of the existing apartments. Other buildings that are beyond their useful age will be replaced. The plan will create more than 400 new apartments for more than 500 people - low-income families, single adults and residents with disabilities. They will live in a part of Austin that is rich with transit and job opportunities. All of the apartments will be affordable, and most would be classified as deeply affordable.

The redevelopment plan also prioritizes residents not being displaced from the square as many of them would struggle to find other housing they could afford that is accessible. Don Jones (pictured here) has lived on Lamar Square since 2016. The veteran says he had concerns when he first heard about all these changes, but he is now confident that residents will be taken care of. He is looking forward to getting a new apartment.
